United Way is the philanthropic hub of Logan County. Since 1955, generations of local residents and businesses make their charitable impact through United Way. When you give to United Way, you become a part of a long-standing solution that works to positively influence the health, education, and financial stability of every person in Logan County. More than just a fundraiser, United Way collaborates with businesses, non-profits, government, and civic organizations to address the growing needs of our community.



## 2025 United Way Campaign Chair

More than 700 volunteers committed time and talent on our Board, committees, and special events this past year. 2,524 individual and 166 local businesses gave of their treasure to lift up our 2025 Campaign. \$1,030,000 was raised as Logan County, the smallest community in Ohio to ever have a \$1 million Campaign for its local United Way, did it for the eighth straight year! 10 workplaces set all-time giving records. Traditional workplace campaigns accounted for 75 percent of our campaign revenue this year.

Doug Boggs, served as the 2025 United Way Campaign Chair. His own journey has been touched by United Way's impact. Through his work at Recovery Zone, a United Way-supported agency, Doug serves as an Incarceration Outreach Program Director and is a certified Peer Recovery Supporter. In this role, he helps identify barriers to recovery and walks alongside individuals as they overcome them. He also serves on the board of the Peak of Hope Shelter, another United Way partner, and is a co-leader and Catalytic Guide with the Logan County Harwood Initiative.

# VOLUNTEERS ENABLE LUNCH BUDDIES TO EXPAND TO ALL COUNTY SCHOOLS



**Lunch Buddies** continues to be a strong United Way program and a favorite of so many of our volunteers who are involved.

We have Lunch Buddies in all our Logan County schools with 230 matches pairing adult role models and 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Some of our volunteers have been with the same buddy for the third year in a row and will see them graduate out of the program this spring. Volunteers commit to spending one lunch period a month with their buddy.

We can't say enough about the staffs at all the elementary schools for working with us to make this possible. Thank you to the volunteers who take time each month to make their visits.

# COMMUNITY CARE DAY



Demolition, Painting, Landscaping, Meals on Wheels delivery, more landscaping, weeding, re-siding, pressure washing, more painting and even decorating a town Christmas tree—these are just a few of the projects that get done on Community Care Day. This past year we had over 400 volunteers and over 35 projects.

Volunteers get paired up with a project from communities throughout Logan County. This annual Care Day has turned into a tradition that many look forward to all year. It's a day to join with co-workers and neighbors to lend a helping hand. Thank you to all who show up year after year.

# HELP WITH BASIC NEEDS

With your support, we were able to help 321 individuals prevent evictions with \$100,000 in financial support through Bridges Community Action's Housing Stability Program, which also provides budget counseling and referrals to other organizations.

Focus on providing food has continued as more than 7,000 Logan County residents received food from United Way funded agencies that are fight food insecurity. Lutheran Community Services served nearly 60,000 meals. Second Harvest Food Bank's mobile pantry distributions throughout the county served over 4,500 unduplicated individuals. GRACE and the Neighborhood Outreach Centers feed children on weekends or over the summer, while LifeCare Alliance delivers meals-on-wheels daily to our homebound senior citizens.

Warm Clothes for Kids outfitted 400 students in Grades K-12 countywide this fall.

Dolly Parton Imagination Library sent over 22,000 books were sent to Logan County children age 0 to 5 years in 2024. Over 166,000 books have been sent over the last nine years.

# POVERTY SIMULATIONS EXPLAIN REALITY, EXTEND EMPATHY



Lutheran Community Services graciously hosted a Cost of Poverty Experience by Think Tank last October. Simulations were conducted for members of Student United Way and Leadership Logan County to help them better understand situations that many in our community face daily.

"The simulation was very moving and very impactful to me," said one participant. "I had no idea of the depth of this and all the issues that come with it! Participants remarked how overwhelming and stressful the experience was as the experience brought to light barriers to everyday living many in our community are facing.

United Way, with the help of 12 local human service agencies, hosted an Agency Speed Dating event for Leadership Logan County. Participants had 5 minutes with each agency to hear from them and switched to the next organization when time was up. This opened up impactful conversations and allowed participants to interact and ask questions as they arose.

C.O.P.E. (Cost of Poverty Experience) simulations will be scheduled for 2026. Let us know if you would like to participate or volunteer.

## LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

Our Allocations Committee approved \$775,000 in funding recommendations to support the work of 24 Funded Agencies in Logan County in 2026. Agency requests exceeded the amount available by 65%. Yet 12 of the 42 programs will receive what was requested. The complete list of 2026 Allocations is on the next page.

In February 2024, 50 community members came together at the Public Innovators Getting Started Lab to learn the Harwood Approach for creating community-led, community-driven change. The network formed three cross-sector action teams made up of community leaders—Youth, Whole Health, and Seniors.

With support from The Harwood Institute and United Way of Logan County, the teams are getting in motion by engaging the community through conversations about their shared aspirations.

The teams have used the public knowledge gathered to take initial actions rooted in what matters to people.

Ripples are starting to spread, including community-based projects like the Neighbor-to-Neighbor program, Windows of Awareness, the Week of service for Students and several parks projects.

Lunch Buddies continues to grow, with new buddies already interested for next year. Stay tuned for Women United updates as they unfold.
